Mary Cohrs, Director, City of Bellaire Library, discussed Bellaire's history during the early 1900's. We saw newspaper ads from that era touting Bellaire as an attractive place to live. Rice Institute was noted as the Harvard of the South; Bellaire was close to the major shopping district; and landscaping was a plus, particularly after Edward Teas founded Teas Nursery.

The Hurricane of 1915 and the Flood of 1919 were setbacks to Bellaire's prosperity and growth.
