Brooke Campbell and Justin Bryant, Volunteer Houston (Interfaith Ministries), described how their program works to connect individuals, groups, and companies with non-profit agencies across Houston. Among Harris and its surrounding counties, Harris County has more than 600 agencies, and over 67,000 volunteers. Fort Bend County has the next largest numbers. Interestingly, beginning with volunteers classified by generation (Boomers, Gen X, etc.), the most recent age group, Gen Z, comprises the most volunteers.
