

Following lunch, Ann Fairchild will once again have these wallet-size and refrigerator holders with medical cards available for members at the registration table, for a cost of \$1 each. The cards provide invaluable information to medical personnel in case of an emergency, whether at home or while out and about. She noted that first responders are trained to check the front of refrigerators in homes for emergency information. **NOTE:** Completing the forms in pencil is recommended, in case information (such as prescriptions) changes. It is recommended that you review your card every 6 months.
