Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo (HLSR)

Rob Stoveken, Committee Member, HLSR, discussed its mission statement, which encompasses their 4 pillars: "HLSR promotes agriculture by hosting an annual, family-friendly experience that educates and entertains the public, supports Texas youth, showcases Western heritage, and provides year-round educational support within the community."

He described in detail <u>and</u> showed videos of the 5 "fan favorite" rodeo events. Everyone greatly enjoyed the videos, particularly the two events with kids as participants. We also learned more about the skills required to be successful in each event. The events are: Barrel racing; Bull riding; Calf Scramble; Chuck Wagon Races; and Mutton Bustin'.

Life Flight

Joshua Cools, MBA, LP, Director of Trauma Service Line, Life Flight & EMS Operations, explained that they have 5 base locations in our area, with the central base at Memorial Hermann TMC. The inaugural flight was in 1976, and they now have a total of 6 aircraft. Each can carry 2 patients, and has a large cabin for improved patient care, including quality CPR. These rearloading aircraft provide safe loading and transport of patients, and once they land on the Memorial Hermann helipad, the patient can be in the ER or OR in 2-3 minutes. They also transport patients as needed to other hospitals within a 150-mile radius. Pilots and crew have extensive training and continuing education. They carry state-of-the-art equipment and blood products. On night missions, they have night vision capability. It is the only non-profit air ambulance in Houston, and the 6 aircraft together perform a total of more than 3,500 adult and pediatric missions each year. Joshua states that the coolest parts of Life Flight are: the people; the non-profit culture; its history (Dr. Red Duke); always progressing; outreach; the highest level of care; and collaboration.
