ANNOUNCEMENTS AND SPEAKER MEMORIES FROM LAST WEEK'S MEETING, APRIL 11

VP Mary Mahon announced that a copy of the LEOH membership log was available at each table for review. Any errors should be noted on the log and given to her or President Ken Euler for correction. Mary then reminded members of the suggestion box - your thoughts on speakers, trips, etc. are appreciated and considered! Mary also reminded members to sign up for the Party Day luncheon, if they had not already done so. Pastor Seann Duffin offered a blessing prior to lunch.



Jeffrey Baldwin, Chaplain, Houston International Seafarers Center, explained that there are 60-90 ships in port each day, among more than 200 private and public terminals that operate 24/7. Five full-time and 2 part-time chaplains and volunteers visit 80,000 to 100,000 seafarers annually. Seafarers come from all over the world, with some speaking little or no English; however, they all work well together, and all appreciate Christmas shoeboxes containing a variety of items put together by volunteers. Almost 9,000 Christmas shoeboxes were delivered to seafarers last year. This is a great opportunity for our fall LEOH service project! Stay tuned for details closer to our Fall LEOH session. Jim Parsons, Programs Director, Preservation Houston, discussed its ongoing non-profit work, which began in the 1970's, in saving our area's irreplaceable architectural and cultural heritage. We saw maps, plans, and photos of early Houston, continuing on through the construction of our freeways, which resulted in demolition of many historic buildings and homes. Many remaining buildings and homes are now being preserved or restored, such as the 1960's era NASA control center that has been refurbished to its original state. Other historic homes and buildings are being restored to their original state on the outside, while the inside is being modernized to enhance safety and functionality. See preservationhouston.org.
