ANNOUNCEMENTS AND SPEAKER MEMORIES FROM LAST WEEK'S MEETING, APRIL 18

VP Mary Mahon announced that copies of the LEOH membership log were now available at the registration table, following review and corrections from members present the previous week. Mary reminded members once again to sign up for the Party Day luncheon, if they had not already done so. Jim Burrough inspired with a reading on "Friendship", and gave a blessing prior to lunch.





Steve Smith, Board of Directors, Zoe Empowers, described their mission of helping orphaned and vulnerable children worldwide. There are almost 53,000,000 children worldwide who need this help to prevent malnutrition, homelessness, trafficking, lack of healthcare, and hopelessness. In the 3-year program, whose total cost averages only \$317, this community-based program focuses on self-sufficiency, through a variety of means, such as group training in their community and vocational mentorships. Current enrollment is almost 50,000 in 7 countries, including Kenya, Rwanda, and Zimbabwe. The photo above shows a group that makes and sells beautiful baskets. Other photos shared with us showed vocations such as barbering and shoe-making. They are achieving the Zoe Empowers goals of being secure, healthy, connected, and prepared. Did you know? According to WHO in 2022

- * 1 in 8 people experience mental illness * 1 M+ adults attempt suicide every year * 40 M diagnosed with bipolar disorder
- * 24 M diagnosed with schizophrenia * 301 M diagnosed with anxiety; (58 M are children and adolescents)
- * 280 M diagnosed with depression; (23 M are children and adolescents)



Dr. Jennifer Boswell, Director of Adult Mental Health Services, The Harris Center for Mental Health and Intellectual Disabilities (ADD), discussed common signs of mental illness, such as mood changes, excessive worry, and traumatic events. We can help by being aware of such changes and offering hope and encouraging the acceptance of help. The Harris Center has 4 outpatient clinics, and numerous crisis text and phone numbers. They have provided over 1.5 million services to those needing help. Adult specialty programs include detox programs and transitional programs for parolees. They also provide mobile outreach teams, crisis intervention teams, and specialty programs for children 3-17 years old. Cost is based on ability to pay, to ensure help can be given to those in need.
