Easter Seals Greater Houston (ESGH) was founded in 1946. The name originated from buying special seals to add to envelopes and letters, to help fund the organization. ESGH serves veterans and others with all types of disabilities, as well as their families, through multiple life-changing services and programs. Their staff of over 240 professionals serve more than 14,500 annually in Houston and 13 surrounding counties. They also reach more than 35,000 monthly via program websites. More than 91% of monies goes to direct client services. They provide early childhood intervention, therapy, camps, and family days. The Caroline School provides extensive services to children with multiple disabilities. BridgingApps.org serves as a shortcut to find apps for specific special needs. ABC13/KTRK-TV was launched November 20, 1954; therefore, they have provided programming for over 70 years. They began broadcasting on the University of Houston campus, before moving to 3310 Bissonnet a few years later. The building's structure inspired Judge Roy Hofheinz to direct an architect to base the new Astrodome on its design. ABC13 reaches 20,000 square miles across 20 counties. Marvin Zindler and Dave Ward were considered institutions and the faces of ABC13 for many years. Currently, there are 13 hours of programming daily of live and local news via TV and streaming. The many facets of programming include on-air, production, marketing, graphics, sales, and community engagement through events such as blood drives, parades, and Share Your Holidays food drive, benefiting the Houston Food Bank.
