Healthcare for the Homeless—Houston
(HHH)



Chief Tittel stressed education and preparing for the worst to reduce risk. At home, smoke alarms should be on every level and in every bedroom. Make and practice an escape plan, to include 2 ways to exit a room. Fire extinguishers should be checked regularly, including inverting them to keep the contents mixed, and reviewing the PASS acronym (pull the pin, aim, squeeze, and sweep). Call 911 only for life-threatening situations. Knowing how to perform CPR can double or triple survival chances. Training programs for CPR and use of an AED are recommended, and are available in the community. In addition to their firefighting skills, the Bellaire fire and EMS can administer blood, IV's, and ultrasounds, and use an advanced airway technique when necessary. In 1999, a group of volunteer family physicians founded HHH as a two-exam-room clinic with a dental chair. They expanded to other locations and eventually began delivering care directly on the streets as well as in their Caroline, Reed, and Cathedral clinics. Their services include medical, mental, dental, and addiction counseling. Mental health disorders are much higher in the homeless population, as is "weathering" (aging more rapidly than the normal population). Transportation to medical care plus supportive housing and social services are lifesaving tools. HHH's *Project Access* provides bus service free of charge to the homeless seeking housing services. To obtain bus service, a rider must register at assistance locations such as SEARCH, The Beacon, and Lord of the Streets.
